Application for Approval of an Institution to be allowed to offer a Standard Residency Programme in Population Medicine or Food Science in the

European College of Veterinary Public Health (ECVPH)

- 1. Date of application (approval is granted for maximum of 5 years from the date of approval)
- 2. Name and address of institute
- 3. Name and address of Programme Director
- 4. Position held by Programme Director (e.g. Head of Department, Institute Director etc)
- 5. What is the principal function of the institute (e.g. veterinary school, research institute, industry R&D etc)?
- 6. Names and qualifications of Resident Supervisors
- 7. Sub-speciality of the offered Residency Programme
- 8. Description of the institute (one page brief description of library facilities, appropriate labs available, courses and training available, access to industries and governmental institutions, residency history how many Residents of Population Medicine or Food Science subspeciality has the institute trained the last five years, EAEVE approval).
- 9. Description of partner/collaborating institutions: please indicate contact (responsible person), and describe the complementary role of the institution in the Residents' training.
- 10. Please outline the Residency Programme that a Resident would undergo in your institute. Make sure to indicate how all aspects of the Curriculum will be covered.

Resident Workshop, 17-19. May 2017, Berne/CH

Seventeen participants (12 amongst them ECVPH residents) attended the residents' workshop on "(Math.) infectious disease models & social network analysis" that took place in Berne from May 17-19 2017. The workshop was designed to provide insights into the basics of infectious disease models, both in theory and by applying exercises using the software R. More specifically, lecturer Salome Dürr touched aspects such as the development and application of different types of models (ordinary differential equation models, Monte Carlo Simulation models, network based models, to give some examples); parameterization of models and its challenges; sensitivity analysis; model verification and validation. Also, the theory and practice of "social network analysis" was introduced by Beatriz Vidondo, a topic that could easily be expanded to fill a workshop by itself. Finally, Gertraud Schüpbach lectured on the link between epidemiological and economic models, and an application on to the economic evaluation of rabies control strategies was discussed.



The workshop was organized by the Veterinary Public Health Institute of the University of Bern. Also, we could recruit two exciting and interesting guest speakers: Tariq Halasa (Technical University Copenhagen) guided the participants through the exercises in R, which was not an easy task! And Christian Althaus from the Institute of Social and Preventive Medicine of the University of Bern gave an interesting talk about how models can be used to gain new knowledge on emerging diseases such as Ebola, MERS or Zika.

The participants were a very active group from different European countries, so that an exchange between the audience and the lecturers was always ensured – an important feature for a lively workshop. Previous knowledge on infectious disease models was unevenly distributed within the group, but the lectures were designed to make sure that everybody could profit at his/her own level from the workshop. The warm and sunny early summer weather allowed us having a dinner all together in a restaurant outdoors with view of the Bear Park located along the river Aare, from which we could observe the emblematic Bernese brown bears while enjoying a cool drink.

We thank the participants for their active involvement, the guest-speakers for their great contribution and the College for co-financing the workshop.
