One Health Mural – Let's play (seriously) and put the One Health Concept into practice September 21st, 13:30 – 15:30

Context: Projects such as greening school grounds or cities, antimicrobial resistance mitigation or zoonosis risk management raise health issues at human, animal and environment interfaces that require multisectorial and multidisciplinary approaches. All international health organisations now, promote the One Health Concept and encourage their staff and stakeholders to work together to achieve more sustainable health measures. Nonetheless, putting the One Health Concept into practice is challenging due to (1) its complexity that can lead in a partial understanding of the concept and (2) the limits of a standardized method for implementing the One Health approach in highly diverse projects.

Objectives: To play and address the One Health challenges. The One Health Mural is a serious game that addresses these challenges by (1) explaining the One Health Concept according to the OHHLEP definition with 4 sets of cards and (2) suggesting a method to develop projects that require a One Health approach, using a case study. As well as highlighting the interdependences between human, animal and environmental health, the One Health Mural analyses the social barriers and levers to implement multisectorial and multidisciplinary health measures.

Beyond reinforcing your understanding of the One Health Concept and approach, the aim of the workshop is to try out this serious game and eventually, run it with your students or colleagues.
